SUPPORT THE VILLAGE OF ASHLEY PARKS & REC LEVY

A renewal of a tax for the benefit of the Village of Ashley for the purpose of maintaining and operating parks and recreational purposes that the county auditor estimates will collect \$13,000 annually, at the rate not exceeding 1 mil for each \$1 of taxable value, which amounts to \$20 for each \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value, for 5 years, commencing in 2024, first due in calendar year 2025

On November 5, 2024, voters will be asked to support a Replacement 2.9 mill / 5-year Operating Levy for the Fire District. This Operating Levy funds all day-to-day operations of the Fire District, to include staffing, training, equipment, and supplies to provide the best services possible to our residents.

The Fire District has provided part-time day staffing since 2004 due to the decline in the number of volunteer firefighters and to decrease response times. In late 2022 with the assistance of a 2-year Federal Reimbursement Salary Grant program, the district began part-time night staffing. The Fire District currently employs 27 firefighters and 1 fiscal officer.

The expiring 2.9 mill / 5-year Operating Levy generates an estimated \$ 399,000 annually.

If supported, the Replacement 2.9 mill / 5-year Levy would generate an estimated \$560,000 annually, costing our property owners \$ 102.00 per \$ 100,000 of assessed property value per year.

The Elm Valley Joint Fire District proudly serves the residents of the Village of Ashley, Oxford Township (Delaware County) as well as Westfield and Peru Townships (Morrow County).
