Thawing Frozen Pipes

Faucets not flowing? Toilet not refilling? Thaw those pipes before they burst!

Look for swelling or frosty patches to locate the frozen section of pipe.

Insulate pipes that are exposed to freezing temperatures to avoid burst pipes.

If a pipe has cracked, shut off your water and place a bucket under the pipe to catch melted water.
